#### Tips on Working with Colored Pencils

These tips are taken from three articles about a Kristen Doty workshop in the Write On Calligraphers' December 2007 newsletter. Thanks to WOC for sharing!

- Colored pencils should be kept extremely sharp. An automatic pencil sharpener helps.
- Two things to look for in a sharpener: (1) automatic shutoff option so pencils don't get ground down too much, and (2) a wide enough opening for fatter pencils like Prismacolors to fit through.
- The best way to use a colored pencil is to apply color lightly, layer by layer. Most pencils are made with wax, which burnishes paper if applied heavily and prevents more pigment from adhering to the surface.
- For colored pencil alone, Rising Stonehenge is one of Kristen's favorite papers, but watercolor is
  absorbed a bit too much and doesn't look as intense as it should. Rives BVK is another good watercolor
  paper, although it's a bit rough unless you want texture. Another good paper is Spectrum Colorfix, which
  has a finish like light sandpaper.
- Lightfastness is an issue with colored pencil. Right now, the best thing to do is to keep pieces behind museum glass out of direct sunlight.

Valley Calligraphy Guild Workshop
















The Capital Calligraphers' Guild welcomes anyone interested in calligraphy.
