## President's Prologue



The Laurie Doctor class was terrific. It was all about Small Books and Verses. We all produced lovely box/envelopes and tiny books. Laurie has a knack of conveying a spirit of creativity and getting all of us to step out of our boxes and unfurl our wings. Quite a treat to come away feeling exhilarated and exhausted and inspired - all at the same time. We learned how to work with neutrals and blend sumi ink and walnut ink to create masterpieces in neutral colors. We made an Accordian book, a tiny Maze book, a large and small square envelope that held a message from our Muse, various tiny books made from all manner of decorated Arches text wove paper.

To hold all of these creations, we worked with Arches black cover and painted it with white gouache letters formed with a mussel shell and various white implements where we practiced our meditative writing, writing, writing. Then to round things out we used the mussel shell with sumi. There was some time spent with neutral colored pencils to decorate the paper which would become a box envelope to hold our Book of Days. Laurie stepped us through the process of cutting the paper to form the envelope and led us through the intricacies of scoring folding and shaping our 1/2 inch thick box.

No cell phones allowed helped us settle in to a peaceful and meditative experience with Laurie reciting poetry to jumpstart our thoughts and help us see our own potential. She also selected music to fit the mood.

A wonderful time was had by all. We all came away with amazing work to show for our day and a sense of blossoming creativity that would give us energy and excitement to forge ahead on our own




