# Classes/Programs

At our December meeting, Aries Manoff brought beautiful ornaments she had been hard at work creating, one for each Guild member. She inscribed an exquisite design in white and gold ink on black cardstock, affixed the cardstock to a round wooden base, and added a resin coating. Board members found their pieces embellished by their names in flawless copperplate intertwined with

the designs. Each one could be hung by a silk ribbon attached at the top. Each ornament was unique and sure to become a treasured heirloom.

For the remainder of the meeting we learned skills with a holiday theme at four craft stations. Amber showed us how to make a festive banner by shaping and cutting pieces of colored paper, writing a calligraphic letter or message on each one and stringing them together. Laura demonstrated the making of paper stars by

laying strips of paper folded lengthwise on a star shape printed on paper, gluing the ends, then weaving the strips so they held together. Caroline taught how to make a Double Z card by folding, cutting, and gluing with a base paper and pre-cut scraps of paper in solid or patterned colors. Yuki also presented a way to make a unique card. The sides of the paper were folded and decorated with gel pens and the open center was completed with brush lettering.
